### 1. [QIONet](#)

This link will take you to the 8<sup>th</sup> SoW Program Priorities page. The Underserved Populations heading is located at the bottom of this page. QIOs can gain access to strategies for recruitment, group training session tips, ListServe discussion summaries and project requirement information. These resources are updated on a regular basis.

### 2. [QNet Exchange \(QNE\)](#)

QNE is a HIPPA-secure site and is the only CMS approved method for sharing confidential information. For information on the sign up process for QNE, please contact your internal QNet Exchange Administrator located at your QIO. On a monthly basis the UQIOSC uploads OMH participant data to the US-Underserved-QIOSC custom exchange group located in QNE.

### 3. [QNet Quest](#)

QNet Quest is accessible through QIONet and provides QIOs with a database of answers to questions that have been asked on Task 1d2. The answers posted on Quest come from CMS, your official source for Task 1d2 information. QIOs can post new questions as they arise.

### 4. [e-news](#)

The e-news is published by the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month via the ListServe. This is an electronic publication that contains the latest information on Task 1d2 including: News, the latest MedQIC postings, Calendar of Events and Conferences, Articles and Resources.

### 5. [MedQIC.org](#)

The Underserved section of the MedQIC site contains numerous resources, including tools, literature, presentations, and weblinks that can assist you in Task 1d2.

### 6. [Community of Practice \(CoP\) Calls](#)

The UQIOSC hosts monthly CoP calls. These calls feature presentations and discussions from QIOs to foster Task 1d2 success. These one-hour calls are held every third Wednesday of the month at 1:00 p.m. CT. The call materials are made available to QIOs two days prior to the call via the Underserved ListServe (Notify). The CoP call is recorded and CDs are available on request from the UQIOSC.

### 7. [Underserved ListServe](#)

The ListServe is a QIO's primary resource for sharing Task 1d2 information among their peers. Sign-up is available through QIONet under the ListServe tab. Users should make sure they sign up for both Underserved/Rural Discuss and Notify. The ListServe provides users with an avenue for discussions with other QIOs and the UQIOSC.

### 8. [Face-to-Face Meetings](#)

QualityNet and AHQA, are held on an annual basis. At these events, CMS and the UQIOSC will present updates pertaining to Task 1d2. QIOs will have a chance to meet with CMS, other QIOs and the UQIOSC team members for further idea-sharing.

### 9. [National Calls](#)

National calls are held twice a year. An expert speaker will present on a topic that is relevant to Task 1d2 or one that has been requested by a QIO. These calls provide the QIO community with an opportunity to learn the latest information on the specific topic and to ask questions.
